

The Reign of Naturalism (metaphysical) & Relativism in Academe

- Metaphysical naturalism the view there is no God or gods and the only thing that exists (and counts as facts) are empirical; when something is explained empirically (fully), that's all there is to say.
- Historically connected with moral relativism and constructivism
- Our academic culture is greatly affected by this.
 Very little Christian cultural influence...

This View of What Is Real Has Consequences including:

- University culture is also dominated by some form of hedonism—including and especially enlightened hedonism
 - Besides the fact this is idolatry, it also suffers from the paradox of hedonism
 - Lots of unsatisfied people who do not think religion, whatever it is, is a viable solution
- It does not have to be this way.

Why care?

The gospel is understood in the context of the larger culture—serious Christians cannot let this slide.
