UNDERSTANDING 2 FORMS

Of Post-Modernism

HISTORICALLY

- Postmodernism (roughly speaking) is a skeptical reaction to Modernism
- Modernism places a strong emphasis on the reliability of rationality (Rationality) and the objectivity of science--PM says too strong an emphasis
- Postmodernism questions the reliability of rationality and the (complete) objectivity of science

TWO PM DISTINCTIONS WITH A DIFFERENCE

- However, there are at least two important distinctions that can be made
- Metaphysical PM skepticism about the nature of ultimate reality - it's alleged there is no one way things ultimately are
- Epistemic PM reality is what it is, but a skepticism about our claims of knowledge and knowledge of reality--skepticism of our description of it

IMPLICATIONS

- Metaphysical Postmodernism is a more radical form of skepticism no objective (mind independent) nature of reality
 - Such a view can promote "reality constructivism"; but can we eliminate AIDs by agreeing that in our construction it doesn't exist?
- Epistemic Postmodernism is less radical (perspectivism in term of knowledge) and/or agnosticism about the nature of reality
 - Use constructions not to construct reality, but to construct our understanding of reality (admits of fallibilism)
